

Important Information from the Goodman Metro District Regarding Improvements to District Owned Parks & Open Space

DISTRICT BEGINS TREE PLANTING

Starting next week, the Goodman Metropolitan District will begin planting approximately 50 new trees throughout the parks and open space in The Farm community.

In 2012, when the District assumed the responsibility for the operation and maintenance of Central Park, Creekside Park, and Highridge Park, the District implemented a comprehensive tree replacement and enhancement program, recognizing that trees as "green infrastructure" improve the community by beautifying the parks and neighborhoods, cleaning the air, raising property values, protecting rivers and streams, and providing habitat for wildlife.

Between 2012 and 2013, the District planted more than 35 trees throughout the parks and open space. With the additional trees planned for 2014, the aggregate will total approximately 85 additional trees over a three year period.

With this substantial investment the District plans to continue its goal of providing a first-class park and trail system for the community.
